Newfoundland Power employees host *EnviroFest* 2019

(St. John's, NL): Newfoundland Power employees will be hosting their annual *EnviroFest* celebrations across the province during National Environment Week, June 2 - 8, 2019.

EnviroFest is Newfoundland Power's annual celebration of the environment which offers hands-on support for initiatives that encourage positive environmental action throughout our province. In 2019, the Company awarded five *EnviroFest* grants. Whether it's improving a park area, enhancing a trail system, planting trees, starting a recycling program or adding/refurbishing a green space, these projects are aimed at enhancing the quality of life in communities across the province for many years to come through environmental action.

EnviroFest 2019 community beautification projects include:

- Municipal Day Park, Reidville, Monday, June 3 starting at 10:00 a.m.;
- Clarenville Rotary Trail, Tuesday, June 4 starting at 10:00 a.m.;
- The Neck, Eastport Peninsula, Friday, June 7 starting at 10:00 a.m.;
- Duck Pond Beautification, Bauline, Wednesday, June 19 starting at 4:00 p.m.; and,
- Carbonear Walking Trail, Thursday, June 20 starting at 1:00 p.m.

Newfoundland Power has a team of Environmental Coordinators in all major operating areas who work with schools, community and environmental partners to identify opportunities to promote environmental awareness. Driven by employees, retirees and family members, Newfoundland Power's Environmental Commitment Program was launched in 1997 as a testament to the Company's long-term commitment to protecting and enhancing the environment. Throughout the years, we have partnered with more than 300 community groups, completed 100 environmental projects, planted over 3,000 trees and inspired thousands of participants each year to take better care of our environment.
